



**Third Sunday of Easter

The Easter message is the message of the Church. Christ died in fulfillment of the scriptures. However, Christ did not remain dead. He rose again.

The readings today show how this became known in the early church. The first reading has Peter preaching and explaining that yes, Christ died but God raised him from the dead. The gospel today is the familiar story of the road to Emmaus. Two disciples are walking, confused and probably sad because Jesus died and they do not understand. Jesus joins them but they do not recognize him. He explains scripture to them. They invite Jesus to join them for supper and finally recognize Him when He breaks the bread.

The church today still learns of Christ in the Scripture and Sacraments. Every Sunday and every time we attend Mass we are taught about Christ in the Liturgy of the Word and receive Him in the Eucharist. Now we are responsible to show Christ to our family, friends and the world.
